The bound of Joy cannot be described when the council announced that our student K.Pravar is the state topper of Telangana State, in the Indian


School Certificate Examinations. He had scored 97.0% of marks along with a centum in Biology.

The Active farm school was a complete different experience for me as well as my friends. We experienced being farmers for a day and had a lot of activities like:

- Food processing session
- Making of a natural pesticide and then spraying it on plants
- Planting paddy.
- Making our own jowar field square.
- The food processing session was

about different kinds of milk and their production, oil extraction from peanuts and few features of wheat husk.

- We made own pesticide by making a thick paste of neem leaves, garlic, tulsi leaves and jaggery mixed with water and gomutra (cow urine).
- After this we planted paddy. It was a different experience. I felt I was sinking in the soil.
- At the last we made our own small square field of jowar. This involved the use of various agricultural tools and a few techniques which were good to know. We also took home two
